face scarred by the lumps of sugar.

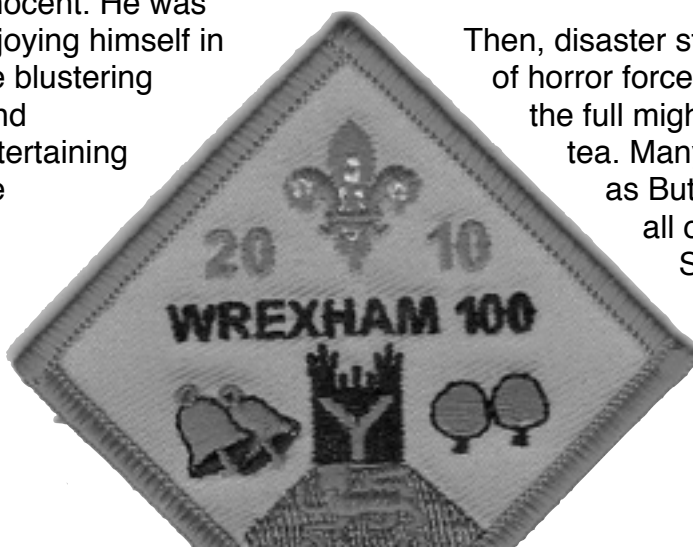
The wind spread it all over, and Butch was left lifeless, scarred, battered, broken.
